The SEEN Oxford short film competition

Make a short film about the SEEN Oxford curriculum project in your school and enter it into our competition.

What is SEEN Oxford?

SEEN stands for Secondary Education around Early Neurodevelopment. Oxford University are piloting 3 lessons around the importance of caregiver – child interactions for healthy brain development. We are keen to hear from students and/or teachers about their experiences of this project.

What should the film be about?

You can cover any aspect of the project: the lessons and activities; interviews with students about what they have learnt; interviews with teachers about what they think about the project. Some suggested questions are given below. The film needs to be 2-5minutes in length. *The only rule is that anybody featured in the film needs to have filled out a consent form.*

How will the films be used?

We will use them to directly communicate the experiences of students and teachers involved in the project, via websites, presentations to funders, educators and other interested groups. Clips might be taken from the films to create a project montage.

Getting permission to film... getting CONSENT

You need to get permission from an individual **before** recording them on video or audio. This is good practice... it is also a requirement for us to accept your entry. Everybody who is identifiable in the film needs to complete a consent form (permission form). For students under 13, this form has to be completed by a parent or guardian.


Think and plan:

Due to the need for consent, you might decide to only film a small number of individuals. If you want to film the whole class, the whole class will need to fill a form in!

How will we know you have permission?

A coordinating member of staff will need to confirm that everybody in your film has completed a consent form. They will then send us the completed consent forms with your short film.
